MESSAGE FROM OUR POTENTATE

As December rolls in, I've realized that this is my last article in the Moslemite as your Potentate. It's amazing how quickly time passes us by and it's almost time for me to move over. I would first thank the Nobility for allowing me to serve on the Divan and as your Potentate. It has truly been an honor representing Moslem and serving you.

Although 2021 was a very challenging, up and down year, I feel much was accomplished and we are setting the stage for a brighter future for Moslem. Selling our beautiful building early in the year was a major step towards financial stability. The annual cost to maintain the building was staggering and with the need to replace the entire roof at a cost of \$750,000+ was

literally hanging over our heads. Even with mediocre fundraising dollars, we will come in with nearly a half million-dollar improvement financially compared to the 2020 numbers and several hundred thousand dollars under the last six or seven year average.

After the original building purchase fell through, we organized another relocation committee which to date, hasn't found a permanent home for us. Our lease is up in Southfield and we will be relocating the offices and storage to a temporary location near the Suburban Collection Showplace in Novi. Many of our meetings and events can continue to be held there at nominal or highly discounted rates.

After cancelling several events the first half of the year due to Covid, we finally got our feet off the ground in May. Every event First Lady Diane and her team planned was successful, fun and financially in the black. I watched her every day and know Lady Di worked hard to make these events a success.

After a moderately successful virtual Sportsman's Raffle, Craig Stigleman, PP and his team hit it out of the park with a wildly successful State Fair/Circus. The two events combined to bring in about 60% of our normal annual fundraising dollars to help take the sting out of the year.

Our office staff of Pamela and Kim have been outstanding. They handled the extra workload caused by the situations Covid, building move, and losing a staff member efficiently and without complaint. I don't know what we would do without them Thank You Ladies.

We must also recognize that Moslem wouldn't be remotely successful at any of our events without the help our ladies. We started talking two years ago with LOS to put on two joint fundraisers that would help both LOS and Moslem. Working together helped to bring larger crowds and strengthen the bond between the two groups. I hope this kind of cooperation can continue for future years.



was given high praise for our fundraisings events, including the Sportsman's Raffle, Circus and Meat Raffle.



It's been a difficult year for everyone. There have been shortages of everything from cars to food to employees. The firearm industry is no different. Shortages of firearms and ammunition have been prevalent across the country and Bass Pro Shops has had a hard time staffing their counters with qualified sales staff. As a result, the fill rate of winner's certificates was at an all-time low and customer service at Bass Pro Shops was less than desirable for our last raffle.

To help alleviate the problem, the prizes were ordered 3 months earlier than usual and the following verbiage will be written on the actual winner's certificate:

*If the firearm won is not available at Bass Pro Shops, a firearm of equal or higher (within reason) MSRP may be substituted if approved by the winner. If the winner would like the firearm listed on this certificate and it isn't in stock, the winner will be referred directly to Roy McBurney, Group Sales Manager and may have an option to wait until the firearm is back in stock.
