MESSAGE FROM OUR POTENTATE

Over the last several years, several Moslem Potentates have dealt with the possibility of having to undergo the process of selling our Southfield Shrine Center due to the cost to maintain the building. Some have had the opportunity to sit down with potential buyers but, up to this point, none have pulled the trigger. It is obviously a very sensitive and difficult decision to sell our beautiful home in Southfield but, it has now gotten to the point that we couldn't wait any longer.

Since December 2019, we have had two potential buyers queued up and an awesome property just waiting for us since last spring so, the time is now.

Last month we had a tiled Special Zoom meeting to cast the final votes to decide whether or not we should both sell our current beautiful Southfield building and purchase the Waterford property to become our new home. On both issues, we needed a 2/3 majority to pass. The results were overwhelming with 95% of the Nobility voting to sell the Southfield building and nearly 80% voting yes to purchase the Waterford property that was presented.

Our Southfield property at 45,000 sq ft is too large, old and costly making it no longer feasible for us to stay. The Waterford property weighs in at 18,000 sq ft sitting on 15 beautiful acres making it the perfect for both indoor and outdoor events of all types.

Purchase agreements on both properties have been executed and I expect we will be closing on both in mid-April. We will then have about four months after closing to vacate the building. We are downsizing and moving to a location that won't have unit rooms, so we will be working with Units to discuss how we will get moved out of their current rooms.

Change isn't easy but, I truly believe that if we are all committed to making this work, this can be the spark we need to begin the rebirth of Mighty Moslem. More information will be shared as it become available. Thank you all for your support.

POTENTATE MESSAGE ABOUT IMPROVING COMMUNICATIONS


Moslemite - There will be 12 monthly magazines. 4 will be mailed and 8 smaller, electronic editions. All will be posted on the Detroit Shriners website.



MESSAGE FROM OUR CHIEF RABBAN

CHANGE IS INEVITABLE

Shriners International and the Shriners International Hospital Board have a goal to treat more children in more places. Shriners Children's Ohio will serve as a model for future changes to the Shriners Hospital system.




MESSAGE FROM OUR RECORDER

From the Desk of the Recorder


Fraternal greeting to all the Nobles of Moslem Shriners.



Shriners Hospitals for Children in St. Louis

An ivestigation led by Farshid Guilak, Ph.D., director of the St. Louis Shriners Hospital Research Center reveals a new link to arthritis. Dr. Farshid Guilak came from Duke University to St. Louis five and a half years ago to be the director of research at Shriners Hospitals for Children in St. Louis. That decision would eventually lead to a breakthrough in the cause and treatment of arthritis, a painful joint condition that affects more than 54 million people in the US annually.

A new study suggests the damaging effects of obesity are not due to body weight but rather come from something much smaller, biochemical signals released by fat cells.

The study focuses on the link between overweight or obesity and the development of osteoarthritis, a painful disease of the joints.

Dr. Guilak said, "We've shown here that it's not overloading of the joints that is responsible for osteoarthritis, but, more likely, a factor given off by fat cells that makes cartilage susceptible to degeneration,"

While historically regarded as an unavoidable part of aging, osteoarthritis is now appearing more commonly in children. This is due in part to widespread increases in childhood obesity, coupled with injuries that commonly occur in adolescents, such as knee ligament tears. Little scientific research had been done in the past on the connection between obesity and osteoarthritis because, Guilak said, it was simply dismissed as a byproduct of overloading the joints with increased body weight. But the new study by investigators at the St. Louis Shriners Hospital and the Washington University School of Medicine shows that weight gain alone isn't the cause.

The researchers used a unique type of mouse that has no fat cells anywhere in their bodies. Even when they were fed an unhealthy, extremely high-fat diet, these mice did not develop osteoarthritis in any of their joints. The researchers were surprised to find that even with a knee injury that normally causes rapid degeneration of the cartilage, fat-free mice were protected from getting osteoarthritis.

Then, the researchers implanted a tiny piece of fat under the skin of these mice, so small it had no effect on their body weight. The mice became susceptible to osteoarthritis, even though there was no weight gain. This showed researchers that fat outside the knee joint plays a critical role in cartilage health.

A study was published in the journal Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences. It was designed and executed by the lead author Kelsey Collins, Ph.D., a postdoctoral fellow in Guilak's laboratory.

"This study demonstrates that factors outside of the knee joint can affect cartilage health, which opens the door for a wide range of new osteoarthritis treatment targets we can investigate," Collins said. "Once we identify the factors given off by fat cells that are responsible for these effects on the joint, we hope to develop new drugs to target them."

Although it could take years to develop a cure, the Shriner team of doctors are making great strides for reducing joint damage for children and adults. We praise them all for their fantastic determination and skill. Thank you Dr. Guilak and the team at Shriners Hospitals for Children in St. Louis.

Many Shriners Hospitals for Children patients attend the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open. In attendance are the system's national patient ambassadors and 22 representatives from each hospital/clinic location. The patients will inspire you and take your attendance to a whole new level. You will hear their stories of strength and accomplishment, and see them walk alongside players as standard bearers, carrying score boards.

Should you choose to participate in the Tournament, you must follow all safety measures implemented by the Tournament with respect to COVID-19. In particular, you may be required to do the following:

- Submit to screening for symptoms of COVID-19, as identified by the CDC at https://www.cdc.gov/ coronavirus/2019-ncov/symptoms-testing/symptoms.html, including temperature checks on a regular basis;
- Submit to possible COVID-19 testing to the extent required by the Tournament;
- Maintain social distancing. Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use hand sanitizer that contains 60% alcohol, including the hand sanitizer provided by the Tournament as often as possible;
- Wear personal protective equipment such as facecloths or masks that meet CDC guidelines.
- Use sanitizing and disinfecting wipes provided by the Tournament as directed by the Tournamen

Should you have further questions, please contact your committee chairperson located in the Volunteer Committees and Volunteer Leadership section of this page. Each volunteer is required to purchase a volunteer uniform. This helps us to defray our costs associated with each volunteer. Our event is operated as a 501(c)3 charity and every available dollar is dedicated to our
