



#### **MESSAGE FROM OUR POTENTATE**

Our Relocation Committee has been working hard to find us a home. They have been meeting regularly and working with a realtor and considering many options. Not all options







#### **MESSAGE FROM OUR RECORDER**

Fraternal greetings Nobles.

The 147th Annual Imperial Session was held in Houston, Texas at the George R. Brown Convention Center from July 4th through July 8th, 2021. There were twenty-four (24) pieces of legislation for Shriners International and six (6) pieces of legislation for Shriners Hospitals for Children. I will do my best to give you a summary of each piece of legislation and how it faired.

Item 1. Would have given Shriners International the ability to accept petition for membership form any candidate that meets the prerequisite for membership as provided in 323.3 of the bylaws of Shriners International. The Board of Directors of Shriners International shall determine the form of the petition for membership, qualifications for membership, balloting, the initiation fee, the initiation procedure and annual dues without membership in a temple. Annual due to be not less than \$250.00 plus assessments. This failed.





- Item 3. The change in the procedure for distribution of the per diem and mileage reimbursement would reduce the face-to-face interaction between representatives and staff at the Imperial Session to reduce possible spread of infectious diseases. This passed.
- Item 4. Meetings of the board of directors could be held not only in person, but by internet or telephonic meeting service provided appropriate notice is given including the necessary means to participate in the meeting. This passed.
- Item 5. Clarifies when the meeting of the standing and special committees occur and that the committee meetings can be held not only in person, but by internet or telephonic meeting service provided appropriate notice is given including the necessary means to participate in the meeting. This passed.
- Item 6. The per capita tax would be increased from \$30.00 to \$50.00 for each member of the temple. This failed.
- Item 7. A temple could accept a petition from a Master Mason or from a candidate of good character provided the person of good character meets the age requirement for Masonic membership in the Masonic jurisdiction of the temple and is thoroughly investigated by the temple. This failed.
- Item 8. The qualifications for serving as a temple Potentate would require serving at least one term as either Chief Rabban or Assistant Rabban and also having attended either the Oriental Guide or Assistant Rabban training seminar as sponsored by Shriners International Education Foundation. However, the qualification that the Noble shall have first attended the Oriental
- Guide or Assistant Rabban training seminar shall not become effective until November 1, 2022. This passed.
- Item 9. Elected officers of a temple divan must have their dues paid in full and up to date for the next calendar year and must be in good standing as a Master Mason to be qualified to stand for election. This was ruled out of order because of Arkansas.
- Item 10. The time for notice to the Imperial Recorder's office of an appointment to fill a vacancy in the office of an elected Representative would be reduced from 5 days to 1 day prior to the opening of the Imperial Session and the method of notification would be expanded to include email or text message. Items was first tabled, and then brought off the table with new wording. The new word would keep the 5 day notice needed but in an emergency, the Imperial Potentate can grant special dispensation if warranted. This passed.

#### MESSAGE FROM OUR RECORDER CONTINUED

- Item 11. The exceptions to the required signatures and effect on other temples for a new temple to obtain a dispensation would now apply within the Republic of Mexico. This failed.
- Item 12. This use of the logos for Shriners Hospitals for Children in any fundraising activity without the written consent of the Imperial Potentate and the chairman of the board of trustees of the Hospitals would be a prohibited practice. This passed.
- Item 13. Shrines International would be permitted to use the lists of members furnished by the temples to disseminate information about solicit gifts, contributions, and bequests to and solicit donation for fundraisers on behalf of Shriners International Education Foundation on such terms and conditions as directed by resolution by the board of directors of Shriners International. This passed.
- Item 14. With permission of a temple Potentate, female guests could participate in marching units or clown groups, if distinguished from Nobles in dress. This failed.
- Item 15. The amendment changes the jurisdiction in the County of Sumter, Alabama from Abba Shriners to Zamora Shriners. This passed.
- Items 16. The amendment gives exclusive jurisdiction in the Republic of Mexico to Anezeh Shriners. This was withdrawn.
- Item 17. The amendment voluntarily changes the jurisdiction in South America between Almas Shriners, Hikmat Shriners, Amal Shriners and Bolivia Shriners. This passed.
- Item 18. The amendment changes the jurisdiction in the Republic of Guatemala from Egypt Shriners to Anezeh Shriners. This was withdrawn.
- Item 19. Anezeh Shriners would be permitted to withdraw from the Western Shrine Association. This passed.
- Item 20. Abou Saad Shriners would be permitted to withdraw from the Southeastern Shrine Association. This passed.
- Item 21. Amara Shriners would relocate to 1900 Palm Beach Lakes Blvd., West Palm Beach, Florida 33409, and the charter would be amended to reflect the change of location. This passed.
- Item 22. The Shrine clubs (Taprooms) found within Moslem Shriners, El Zaribah Shriners, Kerak Shriners, Kalurah Shriners, Oasis Shriners, Naja Shriners, Aleppo Shriners, Lu Lu Shriners, Za Ga Zig Shriners and Arabia Shriners would be permitted to form the "International Association of Shrine Taprooms." This passed.
- Item 23. A petition has been received from Nobles and Master Masons in the country of Brazil for dispensation to open a new temple titled Salah Shriners in Florianopolis, Santa Catarina, Brazil. This passed.
- Item 24. A petition has been received from Nobles and Master Masons in the country of Mexico for dispensation to open a new temple titled Al Atfal Shriners in Culiacan, Sinaloa, Mexico. This passed.
- Shriners Hospitals for Children
- Item 25. The scope of medical services offered would be expanded. This passed.
- Item 26. All current Representatives of the Iowa corporation would become Members of the Colorado corporation without election. This passed.
- Item 27. A declared disaster would be included with a national emergency as a reason for the board of directors to elect by Resolution the members of this corporation. This passed.
- Item 28. A declared disaster would be included with a national emergency as a reason for the required reports to be presented at the next annual meeting and for alternative election procedures to be established. This passed
- Items 29. A declared disaster would be included with national emergency as a reason for the board of directors to adopt, approve and amend all necessary budgets to carry on the corporation business and affairs without interruption. This passed.
- Item 30. A trustee, who has served the requisite number of years to become a trustee emeritus would be ineligible from returning as a full voting member of the board of trustees of Shriners Hospitals for Children. This passed.

May the blessings of our Heavenly Father continue to grace each of you and your families.



## 147<sup>th</sup> Imperial Session Of The Shriners International 2021

Potentates Report on the Houston Imperial Sessions

Temple that wanted to parade, was held Tuesday night.

We returned from the Imperial Sessions in Houston and it proved to be a great week for Moslem. For those that don't know, the Imperial Sessions are centered around 5 days of meetings that focus on Shrine legislation, election of Imperial officers, public relations, special programs, etc. There are a number of ancillary meetings going on before, during and after the meetings each day as well as the preceding days. The Imperial Representatives that the Nobility elects each year as well as the Divan and others attend these sessions. I can't stress the importance enough of having representatives from Moslem attend these meetings.

This past year, outgoing Imperial Potentate Jim Smith wanted to put emphasis on Shriners "having fun in '21". He wanted the individual Shrine centers to focus on bringing back fun and fellowship into the temples. In the evening, various forms of entertainment were available. There was a block party Sunday night sponsored by the International Association of Tap Rooms and the Bellamy Brothers performed in concert Wednesday evening. During the day when representatives are meeting in the sessions, those not attending can partake in activities of their choosing. Lady Di setup a full day bus trip attending the aquarium, space museum and another morning on an open top bus tour of the city. Good times had by all.

Part of the Imperial sessions is about meeting people, making friends, building relationships as well as renewing friendships in Shrinedom. 
