Pam York is the Child Care and Transportation Coordinator at the Shrine Office. **15 YEARS** of taking care of our Shrine Kids, and we won't let her retire! If a hospital can't accommodate a patient, she is instantly on the phone finding a location that will. We couldn't do it without you Pam!

"When Covid hit, the hospitals were not allowing drivers in the hospital. I did much research and found that the Amtrak train was the safest means of transportation as they recirculate their air every two minutes. For some of my families this was their first train trip. Also, some of my patient's opted to drive themselves and get reimbursed for fuel. I will say NOT ONE trip was missed due to Covid. I rocked it and made everything work. I take my job very seriously and consider each and every one of my patients MY KIDS. My Child Care Director, Ill Sir Bob O'Brien is amazing. He is always just a phone call away. When I need assistance, he is always there to talk me through the situation. "—Pam York



It's getting to be Michigan State Fair time again!! I hope everyone is getting excited about this year's MICHIGAN STATE FAIR!!! We are deep in planning for this year's Fair. We are enlarging our ride count by more than 10 rides, bringing our total to over 50 rides. We have added more food trucks!! We are taking steps



to accommodate approximately 220,000 guests at this year's Fair. In 2021, we hosted in excess of 287,000 guests. This was more guests than we were prepared for at the Fair. As a result food lines and ride lines were longer than acceptable. We are taking steps to keep the lines manageable. One big step is we have added parking fees into the ticket prices. Guests can now pull in and park with assistance with no stopping to pay for parking. Another thing we are doing is opening more parking lots at the same time. The Shriners this year will be responsible for operating the Taft Road lot at the Fair. This will open on Friday through Monday. We are going to require Shriners to man this lot and direct traffic to designated parking locations.

We have also raised ticket prices for 2022. This was necessary to offset higher costs associated with operating this Fair. Some of these funds will go towards parking fees and some will go directly to our Carnival operator. The Shrine will share in their percentage of a portion of the increase. By comparable standards to other fairs our fees are below most other fairs in Michigan. One BIG change for this year...our circus tent will be air conditioned. We are working with CAT to add air conditioning to this years tent and an added attraction to our customers. An air conditioned tent to cool down in during the Fair!! We look forward to this addition!!!

What is the Shrine's real contribution to the Michigan State Fair? Our real contribution to this Fair is our volunteer force that has in the past been able to plug every hole wherever and whenever we are asked to do so. It is our clowns both men and women who circulate around the halls entertaining the children and handing out clown cards. It goes down to even Ron who works at the ticket office every year. It is our Shriners that volunteer who continually amaze me by their willingness to assist in all facets of this Fair. So what do we get in return?

Since 2012, this Shrine has received over \$3,200,000 in compensation from this Fair. Last year we received approximately \$363,000 *after* payment to Tarzan, golf carts and hotel rooms. This Fair is financially important to this Shrine. It provides this Shrine with its largest income for the year. Volunteering to work the Michigan State Fair is not only fun but it provides this Temple with badly needed income that lasts us the remainder of the year. I have had the honor to serve as part of the Executive Committee which operates this Fair. It has been my honor to serve both the Fair and our Shrine. This is not a Shrine appointment. I serve do to my personal commitment to this Fair and my commitment to its successful operations. Our Shrine volunteers serve to see that the Michigan State Fair is a success and therefore our Shrine is successful. We are indeed fortunate to have this Fair.

I ask all Shriners to assist us and volunteer at the Michigan State Fair. Come help us in our goal of raising funds for our Temple and seeing this Fair's continued success.

History of the Circus

Philip Astley: The Father Of The Modern Circus



The modern circus was actually created in England by Philip Astley (1742-1814). He displayed a remarkable talent as a horse–breaker and trainer.


In 1768, Astley settled in London and opened a riding-school near Westminster Bridge, where he performed his feats of horsemanship». Astley's building featured a circular arena that he called the circle, and which would later be known as the ring.

The circus ring allowed audiences to keep sight of the riders during their performances (something that was next to impossible if the riders were forced to gallop in a straight line), riding in circles inside of a ring also made this possible for audiences to enjoy. Riders learned to keep their balance while standing on the back of galloping horses. Astley's original ring was about sixty-two feet in diameter. Its size was eventually settled at a diameter of forty-two feet, which has since become the international standard for all circus rings.



Changes weren't restricted to the commercial and physical aspects of the circus. The performance had evolved considerably since Astley and the circus was undergoing fundamental changes. From its inception, the core of the circus performance had been equestrian acts (trick-riding, bareback acrobatics and even comedy on horseback) interspersed with acrobatic, balancing and juggling acts.

During the middle of the nineteenth century, equestrians and tight rope performers were still the true stars of the circus. Floor acrobats began getting more and more attention along with clowns, jugglers and trained animals.



THE CIRCUS TODAY:

The Shrine Circus is Detroit's hometown circus. The circus has performed annually for over 100 years. From famous animal trainer Clyde Beatty and the Flying Wallendas to the bittersweet humor of Shrine Clown Emmett Kelly, the Shrine Circus bring a family show that's thrilling, heart warming, and affordable. The first Shrine Circus in the world, Detroit's circus is still the largest, with one of the finest clown units. According to John H. McConnell, author of *Shrine Circus: The Circus with a Heart*, the longest running Shrine Circus is also one of the most innovative. It features an intimate setting where everyone sees, hears and feels the magic of the circus.

The Shrine Circus was established in February 1906 as a way of lifting spirits during the dead of winter and has been a springtime tradition ever since. It quickly spread throughout the country and today, collectively, it may be the most attended circus, notes McConnell.

In 1906, the Detroit Free Press characterized the first circus: "With a crash of cymbals and a blare of horns, punctuated by the discordant cries of barkers setting forth the merits of various side show attractions—From peanuts to baby elephants, from side show to 'Grand' concert, nothing was lacking to make the circus a complete success. ... Clowns which caused the spectators to laugh themselves almost into convulsions disported themselves around the ring at frequent intervals. Seldom does an audience of such proportions so generally abandon itself to merriment as did last night's gathering."

Shrine Circuses expanded throughout the country by the 1920s, featuring wild and domestic animals, and feats of human daring and extreme skill. As the major fundraiser for the local Shrine, the circus is the visual centerpiece for the organization.

The Shrine Circus remains a traditional, affordable family entertainment experience with the timeless qualities that charmed the first audience in 1906.

Thanks to the Shriners, this show will go on.

THE BIRTH OF A NEW UNIT - HELPING HANDS!

During an interview with potential new members on April 17, 2021, Lady Sue Baer and Lady Hollie Mast had a light bulb moment after these Ladies shared their stories. One candidate related stories of her monthly visits to the Shriners Children's when she lived in California and activities they would do at the hospitals for the kids, like monthly birthday parties and coloring parties. The other candidate, being the parent of one of our own Shriner patients', said the logistics that Moslem Shrine provides to them for transportation and appointments is excellent, however they feel they are missing the emotional support for themselves and their kids both at the hospital and at home. The spark was lit and immediately the idea for a new Unit within our Court was born. We talked about our vision for the Unit and thought there would be a lot of interest from our Court members to be part of this new service Unit. We held our first Unit meeting in June 2021.

The Helping Hands Unit wants to support our local Shrine kid's and their families and work in concert with the Moslem Child Care Program. Since we do not have a local brick & mortar hospital the question becomes how we do that. Working with our Shrine Child Care Program, the goal of this Unit is to provide emotional support to our Shrine Kids and their families during surgeries and hospital visits, recognize birthdays and other milestones of our Shrine Kids and their family's with regularly planned local events. We want to be a resource for the parents and provide emotional support and hand holding as they navigate their time as a Shrine patient and Shrine family. We can provide support in a variety of ways - porch drop offs as needed, coordinate Shrine mini parades to celebrate milestones, phone calls and cards when a Shrine Kid has an appointment, and even provide "cheer" bags when our Shrine Kid prepares for a hospital stay.

According to the Shrine Kids mother, "this picture frame got her through some of the hardest times when she was in the PICU.
