

PP Bob and his wife Judy were the ones who worked tirelessly and coordinated this event for Moslem since its beginning.


Past First Lady Judy O'Brien has graciously accepted the offer to lend her experience and to work with us to bring this event to the Moslem Shrine family again for 2024.

- Question: "What is the status of finding Moslem a new home?
- Chief Rabban Tommy Thompson responds: "On September 12, 2023, the building team had the opportunity to look at a building in Farmington Hills and the results of that initial review (including a walk through) is that it appears to be a very good fit for Moslem. Thanks to the presentation by Illustrious Sir Mike Zelmanski at the last Stated Meeting, the Nobility approved us to continue the investigation of the building including inspection, costs (making an offer), reaching out to the city of Farming Hills for zoning approval and gathering costs for interior remodeling. Once and IF we can reach a cost agreement with the seller, we will schedule a building "walk-through" for the Nobility. If everything lines up, and we can agree on costs, we will call a special meeting to vote on proceeding with the purchase of the building."



Tabs can be dropped off at the Moslem Transportation Bus Garage in Clawson. Call the Garage to make arrangements to drop them off.


