

Secondly, we need members to help and volunteer if Moslem doesn't have volunteers. Other volunteers will be brought in from elsewhere to fill the gaps.



John W. Thornhill

May 1, 1932 - January 17, 2023

John W. Thornhill, age 90 of Farmington Hills, passed away on January 17, 2023.

John ("Jack") leaves behind his beloved wife Mary ("Maisie") of 71 years. John was a loving and devoted father to Diana (David) Copp and Lori Ann (George) Thornhill-Childress, as well as a proud grandfather to Brendan John Childress. He was the dear brother of the late Evelyn (the late Wesley) Hanson, Edward (the late Velma) Thornhill and Gilbert (Rebecca) Snyder.

Born in Detroit, Michigan, John got his first job at age 10 as a newsboy. Following graduation from Northwestern High School, he studied at Highland Park Junior College and worked at Kroger and later Gemmer Manufacturing Company until he was drafted into the Army, serving from 1952 until 1954. Following his honorable discharge, John began work at Chrysler Corporation and remained there until he retired as a General Foreman in 1987.

John was a lifelong fan of the Detroit Tigers, Red Wings and Lions, in good and bad years. He loved sports, was a great athlete and had a chance to try out for the New York Yankees but the Army called.

John's wife Mary was born in Belfast, Northern Ireland. Together and with their daughters, they traveled the U.S. and the world, including many trips to Ireland and England to visit family and always enjoying learning about the places they visited.

John grew up attending St. John's Episcopal Church in Detroit before transferring to the Church of the Redeemer in Southfield. At both Churches, he was active on the Vestry, served as Sunday School Chairman and as a Lay Reader.

John's best friend was Austin Pate. They grew up together attending services and Boy Scouts at St. John's Church. Once they both had married (Austin to Jeanne) and had families, the friendship grew even closer as the families bonded, sharing godchildren, vacations, holidays and social engagements. The closeness between the families continues to this day and we are certain that Austin, along with Jeanne, was the first to welcome John to his heavenly home.

John tirelessly devoted his time to many charitable and service organizations. John was a chaplain for the American Legion. In 1957 he joined the Masons and was raised as Worshipful Master of University Lodge 482 in 1966. John was a lifetime member of the Masons, based at Northville Lodge 186. In 1978, John joined the Scottish Rite, Valley of Detroit, rising to the rank of Sovereign Prince.

John was a long-standing member of Moslem Shrine where he served as Illustrious Potentate in 2001. With the Shriners, John served as Circus Chairman, Director of Child Care and as a Member of the Board at the Chicago Shriners Hospital. He was also Director of the Reception Unit, a member of the Royal Order of Jesters, and Past Masters Unit.



From time to time, I am questioned about what Shriners Children's can or cannot treat. I have attempted to compile a very comprehensive list.

Since our first hospital opened its doors in 1922, providing care for pediatric orthopaedic conditions has been a foundation of Shriners Children's. We can help children with essentially any orthopaedic condition, other than an acute trauma.

Orthopaedic Care

Shriners Children's provides medical and rehabilitative services to children with congenital deformities and conditions, problems resulting from orthopaedic injuries, and diseases of the neuromusculoskeletal system.

Innovative treatment and therapies

Many of our locations provide pediatric orthopaedic care. Commonly treated conditions include:

- Clubfoot
- Hand disorders
- Limb deficiencies/discrepancies
- Legg-Calvé-Perthes disease and other hip disorders
- Scoliosis (curvature of the spine)
- Osteogenesis imperfecta (brittle bone disease)
- Juvenile idiopathic arthritis
- Orthopaedic problems associated with cerebral palsy and spina bifida
- At 12 of our locations, the orthopaedic physicians and clinical staff have access to motion analysis centers. These high-tech facilities use a system of reflective markers, high-speed cameras, and computers to develop a model of a child's walking pattern that can provide data to assist the medical team in recommending the best treatment plan.

Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services, LLC

In addition to innovative treatments and therapies, several Shriners Children's have in-house pediatric orthotic and prosthetic services (POPS) departments. The POPS teams fabricate custom-fit devices in kid-friendly environments. Collaborating closely with physicians, nurses, and occupational and physical therapists, the best possible outcomes are achieved for their patients.

Services to support optimum health and independence

Our goal is to help each child become as healthy and independent as possible. We provide a complete range of appropriate medical and rehabilitative care to achieve this objective, including surgeries; physical, occupational and recreation therapies; and orthotic and prosthetic services.

At Shriners Children's, each patient receives an individualized care plan incorporating the full range of needed multidisciplinary services, always incorporating the patient and family's goals, and addressing their concerns.

Burn Care

The Shriners Children's locations that specialize in burn injuries have been leaders in burn care, research, and education since opening in the mid-1960s. Thanks to the cutting-edge medical care provided at these hospitals, thousands of children have a greater chance of surviving from all types of burn injuries. every year.

Burn care and other specialized services

The Shriners Hospitals specializing in burn care provide critical, surgical, and rehabilitative care to children with varying degrees of new and healed burns. Each state-of-the-art hospital is staffed and equipped to provide

reconstructive and restorative surgery for healed burns, as well as treatments for various other skin conditions. Three of our four locations that provide burn care also treat cleft lip and palate.

The range of treatments needed by patients with burn injuries can include skin grafting procedures, continuous enteral feeding, infection control and procedures to lessen the effects of scarring. In addition, aggressive rehabilitation is typically necessary, including therapy to improve range of motion, and the use of specially fitted garments, splints and other orthotic appliances to improve the patient's ability and appearance. Once a patient has recovered sufficiently to return to their homes and communities, Shriners Children's helps to ensure a smooth transition through its readjustment and re-entry programs.

The medical staff at Shriners Children's is renowned for their expertise in critical care, particularly in techniques that may help save the life of a patient with severe burn injuries – such as fluid resuscitation, management of smoke inhalation, early excision and skin grafting, and management of increased metabolism.

Since Shriners Children's entered the burn care field, the survival rate for children with burns over more than 50 percent of their body surface has doubled. In addition, today, patients with burns over 90 percent can survive, and go on to lead full, productive lives.

Spinal Cord Injury

Each year 12,000 new cases of spinal cord injury (SCI) are reported throughout the U.S. Approximately 10 percent affect children under age 16. In the mid-1980s, Shriners Children's established the nation's first SCI rehabilitation programs specifically designed for children and teenagers.

Innovative care contributes to recovery

At Shriners Children's, an interdisciplinary team of surgeons and other physicians, therapists, therapeutic recreation specialists, psychologists, social workers, and dieticians work together to provide individualized, comprehensive care plans for our patients with SCI. In addition to providing treatment, our staff collaborates with the patient's family members to help them understand the social, emotional, and developmental implications of an SCI to help ensure the best possible outcome for the child, including the ability to have a full, productive life.

Innovative therapies offered at Shriners Children's include body weight supported manual treadmill training or robotic treadmill training with the Lokomat, a device that automates movement therapy and improves the efficiency of treadmill training in patients with neurological movement disorders, such as spinal cord injury. Both therapies provide weight-bearing opportunities and can help stimulate muscles and build strength and stamina.

Our programs also offer functional electric stimulation (FES), which is a sophisticated, computerized system that sends small doses of electrical current to peripheral nerves, stimulating paralyzed muscles. FES can be used with specialized bikes to provide an opportunity for exercise.

We also emphasize activity-based rehabilitation, including aqua therapy, pet therapy and adaptive sports. These activities also increase strength and stamina and enhance social interaction, confidence, and independence.

Emphasizing independence and confidence

In addition to exercise and therapy efforts, we offer a range of experiential programs designed to increase independent living skills, build confidence, and strengthen self-esteem.

The health care system's SCI program is designed to provide the complete range of services needed to ensure patients recover to the greatest extent possible.

Cleft Lip / Cleft Palate

At Shriners Children's, patients with a cleft lip and/or palate are treated by a multidisciplinary group of specialists who work as a team to improve the child's appearance and their ability to eat, breathe and communicate. Each patient's unique treatment plan may include surgery, orthodontics, hearing, speech, and psychological therapies, along with specialized support. The goal of the Shriners Hospital treatment program is to help each child achieve optimal function, improve their facial appearance to the fullest extent possible and restore their self-esteem.

Cleft lip and palate deformities are one of the most common birth defects in the U.S., occurring in approximately one of every six hundred births. Clefts occur when the tissues that form the upper lip and roof of the mouth fail to join before birth. Cleft deformities vary in size and because the lips and palate develop at various times, it is possible for babies to be born with a cleft lip only, a cleft palate only, or both. The condition is associated with alterations in oral function including eating, speaking, and hearing due to problems with growth and structure of the face. Cleft lip and palate is corrected by reconstructive surgery in conjunction with multidisciplinary therapies. Cleft lip and palate is a common and serious condition. Shriners Children's is committed to improving care for children with this condition through a comprehensive, coordinated program of clinical excellence, education, and research.

Care for cleft lip and/or cleft palate is currently available at nine Shriners Children's. Available multidisciplinary services include surgery, orthodontics, hearing, speech, psychological therapies, and additional support services. Services may vary at separate locations.

Our mission






