• Question: When are our 2024 dues due by?

Recorder Ill. Sir Bob Pate responds: "Dues notifications are always sent out several months in advance and are always due by the first of January."

Question: Why did Moslem raise our dues by \$20.00?

Assistant Rabban Gary Lewandowski responds: "During the 2023 Imperial session a dues increase of \$30.00 was proposed but the delegation voted that increase down. Then a \$20.00 dues increase was proposed, and that increase was approved. Therefore, it was the Imperial Shrine who raised the dues and not Moslem, and all Shrine Temples will realize that \$20.00 increase, but the extra \$\$ does not go to Moslem Shrine, it goes to Shriners International to run their operation."

As we move forward, you will be notified of the date and time that all Nobles will be invited to inspect the property and then if all is in order vote on the purchase.







In closing, I wish to extend My Sincerest Condolences to our Nobles and their Families who have been visited by the black camel.



MESSAGE FROM OUR RECORDER

From the Desk of the Recorder

The following information is directed to all Clubs and Units. The directives listed below come from General Order #1 of Shriners International.

De Minimis Donation of Fraternal Funds

It is permissible for a Temple of Club, with the approval of the Potentate, to make a de minimis donation of fraternal funds to a charity of community organization other than Shriners Hospitals for Children or Shriners International Education Foundation. A donation is "de minimis" if it and all other donations from that Temple or Club do not annually exceed \$1,000.00. (U.S.D.).

Clarification: Units fall under Temple. A total contribution by all clubs and the temple (including units) cannot exceed \$1,000.00 in a year.

Unit and Shrine Club Leader Information

- (a) **Election of officers**: The election of Club/Unit officers shall be held on or before October 31st each year.
- (b) **Duty of Club/Unit Secretary:** It is the duty of the Club/Unit Secretary (or the person performing those duties regardless of title) to:
 - 1. On or before November 30th of each year, provide to the Temple Recorder or update within Webfez membership tracking system the presently elected Club/Unit officers for the ensuing Shrine year including verified name, address, telephone number(s), email address and other relevant information.
 - 2. On or before December 31st of each year, provide to the Temple Recorder or update within the Webfez membership tracking system the list of Club/Unit **members** for the ensuing Shrine year including verified name, address, telephone number(s), email address and other relevant information.
 - Should the Club/Unit Secretary (or the person performing those duties regardless of title) update the information above directly into the WebFez membership tracking system, they must notify the Temple Recorder on or before the respective date that the information has been verified and that the directives listed above have been completed.

(c) Duty of Temple Recorder

- 1. Ensure that all Clubs/Units of the Temple have been created within the WebFez membership tracking system and populated with the current officers and members.
- At the discretion of the Temple, provide appropriate access for Club/Unit officers to the WebFez membership tracking system. If the Temple chooses not to provide this access, the Temple Recorder will be responsible for annually updating all pertinent Club/Unit information within the WebFez membership tracking system including officers and membership.
- 3. Follow-up and confirm with all the Temple Club/Unit Secretaries (or the person performing those duties regardless of title) that the duties of the Club/Unit Secretary have been completed and fulfilled as listed in the directives and by the dates above.
- 4. On or before December 31st of each year, update of ensure that the WebFez membership tracking system has been updated with the presently elected Club/Unit officers for the ensuing Shrine year including verified name, address, telephone number(s)





Greetings from the hardest working Unit in the business, the Clown Unit. The Clown Unit has had a LONG summer filled with many events and activities. The Joeys have been busy with unit meetings/practice, parades, charitable outings, and the grand-daddy of all events – the Shrine Circus at the Michigan State Fair.

We started our shenanigans on July 4th with the Wyandotte parade where the 99-year-old Clown-Mow-beel, the Model-T, made her annual drive down Biddle Ave, and she ran like a top (but I do believe the driver may have stalled her out one time, but quickly recovered...they call that operator error, Sunshine). As usual, the veteran clowns rode in the Model-T and the rest of us lowly joeys had to walk the Parade route. Thankfully the weather was agreeable, and we didn't mind dragging or carrying our individual parade props down the 1.5 mile parade route. On July 22 the Joeys reconvened in Troy, MI for a charitable outing for the Lucky Fin Project. Lucky Fin is a Charitable organization for Kids with limb-differences. The Joeys tied balloons and interacted with the wonderful kids and families who traveled to Troy from all across the United States. I must admit that this event was far more emotionally impactful than I expected and I'm advocating for it to become an annual stop for the Clown Unit; It reminded me that when I complain about ordinary troubles I should probably just shut up. When the Lucky Fin event ended, we loaded up our gear and headed to Dearborn to tie balloons at the Dearborn Goodfellows Picnic. That day we tied roughly 400 balloons in total – a couple of them actually looked like the animal we claimed they were. July didn't end there for the Clown Unit however, we participated in the Shrine Family Picnic tying balloons and acting like buffoons.

August was mostly a slow month for the Joeys, but we did conduct a meeting/practice in preparation for the Shrine Circus at the Michigan State Fair. The Clown Unit started arriving at the Suburban Collection Showplace on Wednesday afternoon and immediately set to work with entertaining the public at VIP night and during the VIP Circus. We also did a Fox2 news spot that afternoon with the "Hall of Shame Reporter" Rob Wolchek. This was just a warm up folks because the next day things really started jumping. The Unit did another Fox2 News Spot at 8:30 am (getting up and ready at about 6am) on Thursday morning and then worked 4 circus performances. Friday we did 4 circus performances and Saturday we were up early again for the 5K run which started at 8am - no we didn't run it, we cheered on the runners as they passed through the Circus tent the we went right to our normal schedule of 4 daily shows. Sunday the now exhausted Clown Unit had another 4 shows. Monday, which was brutally hot/humid, saw the Clowns do 3 Circus shows. In total the Clown Unit did 20 Circus Performances of the "Strong Man" Skit and a bunch of extra "stuff" that required us to get up EARLY. This Joey, like most others was averaging over 6 miles of "steppin" per day, and let me tell ya my dogs were howlin!! But we did it with a smile on our faces because we were making folks smile and we were representing the MIGHTY MOSLEM!! We cant wait to do it all over again next year.

Hello Nobles,



Thank you for allowing me to serve as your representative at Erie Hospital. It truly is an honor to be involved at the hospital level. As an Erie Board Member, I was given the opportunity to attend a meeting in Boston in late July that went over quite a few things that were interesting and pertinent to the Shriner fraternity and our healthcare system that I want to share with you all.

As you can imagine, all the Imperial brass were present, including several members of the Imperial leadership, and our very own Imperial Sir Larry Lieb. Various members of leadership gave presentations and shared important information and perspectives over a few days span. The overarching goal of the meeting was to share with the hospital board members the leadership's vision moving forward.

I would say the meeting content primarily fell into three areas, as outlined below with some explanation and insight as to where leadership plans to take us into the future.

- The first is identity. We are still operating under the name Shriners Hospitals for Children, but due to restrictions with CMS and some of the changes being done to our facilities, we will now be known to the public as Shriners Children's. As our healthcare system evolves, it has become necessary for some of the full-blown hospitals to follow a clinic model. As such, I am very proud to be part of the Erie model, which was the first clinic in our system. That model was envisioned and shaped by our own past potentate, Bob Lee as the Chairman of Erie Hospital and Board member, Jack Horner.
- Next, the leadership sees it fit to expand our health system to the international marketplace. We are not speaking of only the Americas, but rather an expansion to include the Asian Rim and other distant places. There are children who require attention, and we are honored to provide it.
- Finally, a new brand tagline is being rolled out. It is "more children in more places at less cost." It more effectively represents the direction of the hospital. You'll start to see it on promotional materials in the coming weeks.

Now that you're totally confused, I'll try to sum it all up in a few sentences that will bring light through the clouds. As our fraternity expands, it's expanding internationally, we are picking up more Nobles throughout the world at a greater pace than ever. As these Nobles become part of our fraternity, they too want to participate in our charitable endeavors. Therefore, creating a need internationally to take care of children.

The question remains, "How does leadership believe it's best done?" One way is to open clinics that are close to these patients, so that when a Noble loads a child in their car and drives them to the Shrine Hospital, they try to make it less than a one-day trip. These things are happening, believe it or not. As you already know we have three facilities in Mexico presently and are looking to add a couple more. We are also looking to the Philippines to add facilities. So, the challenge becomes how to do it in a financially prudent manner. The direction is to build the additional clinics, and potentially contract with local doctors and clinics to serve as Shriner practitioners / facilities, for maybe a day or a week. And this approach to use local doctors is not just for an International model but intended for here in the United States as well. Advancing this approach is made possible through advancements in patient-focused software and various tele-medicine tools, backed by the Shriners brand. By taking advantage of these programs and tools, as well as other cost-saving factors, we hope to expand and attract an even greater



number of children to be treated at our facilities. That is the strategy behind "More children at more places at less cost."

Like me, you are probably thinking 'how does that affect Moslem Temple?' Our fraternity will stay the same without any significant changes. This metamorphosis will largely be seen at our Healthcare System. However, as your treasurer and a divan member, I can assure you that Tampa looks to us to assist in the transportation of these international patients.

As most of you know, burn cases are decreasing precipitously, and this is a good thing. It is due in part to continued education of parents and increased use of non-flammable goods in the manufacturing process, which Shriners has advocated for decades. Despite the decline in burn incidents, catastrophic accidents still happen and require special care. That said, the international facilities are not equipped to admit burn patients. Therefore, Tampa relies on the Moslem Transportation fund for air ambulance services for some of these burn patients internationally to our burn hospitals here in the states. I'm sure other temples are also being tapped on the shoulder as well. However, it's Moslem's proportionately large balance in the transportation fund that's caught the eye of Tampa, and I believe they're appreciative of the help we've been able to provide.

Again, thank you for allowing me to be your Shriners Children's Erie representative. I know a lot of Hospitals within our network are converting to the Clinical model, but it was Erie a decade ago that envisioned the clinical approach by using a partner hospital to perform many of the surgeries. As an independent hospital, we would have never been able to perform enough surgeries to satisfy the definition of a hospital by CMS, by partnering with Pittsburgh Children, Erie is consistently the lowest drawer on endowment. We are now drawing less than a half a percent of the total draw of all the facilities combined. I'm very proud of that.

May God Bless our Drivers and Childcare Staff – to keep them safe on their greatly appreciated task.


SHRINERS CHILDREN'S OHIO



Tabs can be dropped off at the Moslem Transportation Bus Garage in Clawson. Call the Garage to make arrangements to drop them off.


