## Shriners Children's and Moslem's Childcare

To many, it may be surprising to learn that the majority of Shriners have never visited a Shriners Children's location or any of the outreach clinics currently providing world class care to children and families in need. It should also be noted that this phenomenon is not unique to Moslem and encompasses Nobles that have been a member of this fraternity for decades down to those joining this year. Over the past few years, it appears that our Nobility is distancing themselves from our Philanthropy. This is by no means the fault of the Divan, a Unit, a Club or any individual Noble, it is simply a fact, and it is something that I believe we need to correct.

The reason that I am highlighting this trend is that it is important to not lose focus on what it means to be a Shriner outside of picnics, parades, various "fun" activities, and fundraisers. Being a Shriner is supporting "the World's Greatest Philanthropy" which is, Shriners Children's.

### Our statistics:

- 1,592 children in Moslem's care. Note – some of these may receive care monthly, yearly, or are now above the age of 18 but may still be receiving care.
- We are affiliated with Chicago IL, Erie PA, Ohio, Philadelphia PA, Greenville SC, and Montreal Canada.
- We are supporting transportation to and from various locations in the U.S. as well as from different countries such as, but not limited to:  
Mexico / Nepal / Philippines / Cuba / China / Ukraine / the E.U. / New Ghana / Guatemala / Pakistan / India / Brazil / Fiji / St. Vincent / Venezuela / Nigeria

- 2023 statistics for Chicago Children's only:
- Operating budget is slightly over \$1,000,000 per week
- 2,200 new patients
- \$1.5 million in research grant funding
- 24 clinical exam rooms
- 16,260 outpatient visits
- The only accredited Motion Analysis Center in Illinois, Iowa, Indiana, or Wisconsin
- 3,100 pediatric psychology visits
- More than 90 physicians and advanced practice professionals
- 1,242 surgeries
- 16,592 visits to rehabilitation therapy services
- Patients from 38 countries
- 25% increase in spine surgeries with implants
- 99 residents completed a clinical rotation
- 15 hospital-affiliated Shrine locations
