General Chairman's notes

I have been a member of Moslem Shrine since May of 2007 and was fortunate enough to be Potentate in 2019. Recently, it has come to my attention that I am considered by some to be "one of the old guys" which, to be honest, I find to be both an honor and extremely amusing.

However, from an "old guys" perspective, it appears that ever since we collectively went through the experiences of Covid, the discontent or frustration of being a Moslem Shriner is more prevalent than in pre-Covid times. So, I would like to share my thoughts on this....

One of the most valuable lessons that I learned very early on was that being a Shriner is not easy and quite frankly, I don't believe that it is meant to be. One of the main tenets taught to every new Shriner is that you are asked to give freely of your Spirit, Time, Talent, and Means to the fraternity and to Shriners Children's. Us "old guys" know that the implications found within those tenets are actually very complicated and can be deceptive in their simplicity of wording. It is a financial burden. It is time that is taken away from friends and loved ones. It may add a degree of strain to relationships. It may lead to increases in stress and anxiety, a feeling of being excluded or ignored. It may lead to conflicts with either a group or an individual, a feeling of inadequacy, jealousy, at times it makes you both angry and sad. Sometimes it may feel like there is no value in being a Shriner – and that is just to name a few....

When you look at these issues, regardless of the level that you have been or may now be experiencing, the model points to a very simple fact: the Shrine is Family. Albeit somewhat larger than a traditional nuclear family, the family dynamic is there. Every individual within a family experiences happiness, sadness, conflict, satisfaction, dissatisfaction, elation, and disappointment directed either internally or externally. While it is unfortunate that not every issue may be favorably addressed or overcome, it is the dedication to Family that is the cornerstone for any member of the Shrine to be content and for Moslem to move forward.

There is a common idiom amongst Masons and Shriners that states "the more you put into it, the more you will get out of it." Personally, I can state without hesitation that is entirely true. While I will freely admit that I have not seen eye-to-eye with everyone, with decisions made or directions taken that has impacted Moslem over the years, I still would not trade my Shrine experience for anything. Again, Family.

I can summarize my personal opinions in dealing with issues and/or discontent within Moslem in lessons that I have learned and note, they are in no particular order. It is entirely up to you to find value in them or to cast them aside:

- The majority of Shriners will aid you on your path if you ask them for help. There is a huge pool of knowledge and resources within Moslem Shrine that simply goes either unused, undervalued, or ignored. Never be afraid or ashamed to reach out.
- Think for yourself. Gather all the relevant information available before you make a final decision on any issue regardless of what the underlying concern may be.
- 3. If you have an issue with someone or something, address it. Don't wait for someone else to do it for you as it will likely never happen, and the discontent will only increase over time. Hopefully, the issue may be resolved to everyone's satisfaction.
- 4. If there is a role within the Shrine that interests you, then make your desires known and either volunteer or apply for it. Don't wait for someone to ask you to do it as the opportunity may slip away.
- Challenge yourself. Pick a personal goal at one, five, and ten year increments and strive for it.
 You will be amazed at what you can accomplish, and the satisfaction can be immense.
- 6. The Divan's roll is to not only secure the future of Moslem Shrine and its membership but, to support each Noble on their individual path. Always remember that they are there to support you just as much as they are asking you to support them.

- 7. If you don't like the direction that Moslem is going, there is an election every year for a position on the Divan. Compete for a spot and have a voice within the Temple leadership. Trying to find a workaround to the process or trying to impact the process from the sidelines will likely fail and it may ultimately cast you in an unfavorable light.
- 8. Know the bylaws Temple, Unit, Club, Shriners International, and Hospital.
- 9. Every Noble has the right to officially criticize actions taken or decisions made that they may feel strongly against. However, along with that criticism, offer an alternative or solution to your concerns as you may have thought of a path no one else has.
- 10. If there is an activity that you enjoy but the Shrine does not officially offer it, then start a new Club or Unit. All it takes is a handful of like-minded Nobles to get it going.
- 11. The rumor mill is more than likely to be wrong.
- 12. Do everything in your power to keep your word. If you cannot, regardless of the circumstances, it is your responsibility to explain why.
- 13. Try and leave your pride and ego at the door.

 Personally, much easier said than done....
- 14. Communication and networking are vitally important. There are over two hundred Shrine Temples, get to know some of the members from other Temples during your travels or at various Shrine events.
- 15. Visit a Shrine Hospital whenever the opportunity presents itself. It can be a life changing event.

- 16. Titles can be impressive or even admired but, ultimately it all boils down to the character of the Noble wearing the fez.
- 17. Get your Lady involved. While this is a fraternity, the support of the Ladies, either individually or in groups, is critical for Moslem's success. Never let them forget that....
- 18. Surround yourself with friends that you trust. If you have questions or concerns, listen to their advice and counsel as they will likely see things from a viewpoint that you have either overlooked or ignored.
- 19. Find someone to mentor. You likely had one so, share the experience. You both will win in the end.
- 20. It's not easy because Family is not easy.

My conclusion is simple, the path chosen by any Shriner is unique and there will be discontent along the way. However, it is important to remember that these issues can be overcome either alone or with the help of Family. Ultimately, that is all that matters, and the decision is entirely up to you - just don't give up.

The New Moslem Shrine Temple

The new Moslem Shrine Temple in Farmington Hills is progressing steadily towards completion. Dedicated Nobles have contributed over 500 volunteer hours, allowing us to open the business office and meeting rooms. Outdated office furniture has been replaced with modern alternatives.

Currently, two spacious meeting rooms are available for immediate use by our units, clubs, and Ladies groups upon request through the Shrine office. We are now focusing on enhancing the social areas of the building. Plans include a 2,000 sq ft social room featuring a 24-foot bar and large screen TVs. Additionally, the rear of the building will feature a 5,000+ sq ft room with high ceilings and a stage, perfect for hosting events such as our renowned meat raffles and more. A small commercial kitchen will also be installed.


After the 4th of July holiday, demolition of several walls will commence to expand the room sizes. Our architect is finalizing construction drawings required

by the City of Farmington for approval to begin construction of the social rooms. While there is no strict timeline for completion, we are committed to steady progress and aim to stay under budget.

The Divan recently hosted the first Stated Business Meeting in the pre-demo hall, which was well received. As Nobles toured the premises, they could envision the building's promising future. We are pleased to have initiated ten new Nobles who were fezzed in the "fishbowl" meeting room, witnessed by dozens of Nobles.

Looking ahead, this summer will be filled with exciting events at the Shrine, including an afterglow following the Summer Sportsman's Raffle on July 20th and the Shrine Family Picnic on August 3rd.

We are also planning a building dedication ceremony and open house with the Most Worshipful Grand Master, with the date to be determined.




