

From the Desk of the Recorder

As I look out the window and write this article, I can see the leaves on the trees turning colors and some are falling to the ground which means fall has arrived and it is also time for 2022 dues and some elections are required now with some later in the year.

2022 Dues

2022 dues are due on or before January 1, 2022, for a Noble to be considered in good standing with his temple. Dues are coming in ahead of 2021 rate. Thank you to those Nobles who have paid their 2022 dues. Dues can be paid by check, call the Shrine office to pay with credit card or you can pay your 2022 dues online at detroitshriners.com under the pay dues tab. You will need your member number and Shrine number which appears on your plastic due card. This method of payment was set up this last summer. If you have any questions or problems, contact the Shrine office at 248-569-2900 Ext 4.

Unit and Club Elections

Per Shriners International, Units and Clubs are to hold their elections on or before the end of October. The results of those elections are to be submitted to the temple Recorder on or before the end of December. Unit and club elections are to be approved by the Potentate Elect. The temple Recorder is to provide to Shriners International on or before the end of December the results of Unit and Club elections.

Moslem Shriners Elections

Monday, December 6, 2021, will be the election of officers of Moslem Shriners for the year 2022. The Stated Meeting and election of officers will be held at:

The gavel goes down at 7:00 PM. A 2021 dues card will be needed to enter the meeting. If you are planning on campaigning for an office, please see the Election Regulations:

§325.11 Elections Regulations

- (a) **Electioneering.** A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish, and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publications, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email, or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) **Expenditures Prohibited.** The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) **Violation.** For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

Beginning of Thanksgiving in America

In 1789, following a proclamation issued by President George Washington, America celebrated its first Day of Thanksgiving to God under its new constitution. That same year, the Protestant Episcopal Church, of which President Washington was a member, announced that the first Thursday in November would become its regular day for giving thanks, "unless another day be appointed by the civil authorities." Yet, despite these early national proclamations, official Thanksgiving observances usually occurred only at the State level.

Much of the credit for the adoption of a later ANNUAL national Thanksgiving Day may be attributed to Mrs. Sarah Joseph Hale, the editor of Godey's Lady's Book. For thirty years, she promoted the idea of a national Thanksgiving Day, contacting President after President until President Abraham Lincoln responded in 1863 by setting aside the last Thursday of November as a national Day of Thanksgiving. Over the next seventy-five years, Presidents followed Lincoln's precedent, annually declaring a national Thanksgiving Day. Then, in 1941, Congress permanently established the fourth Thursday of each November as a national holiday.

With Thanksgiving Day just a few weeks away, I thought it might be interesting to take a close look at the meaning of thanksgiving. According to Webster's New World College Dictionary, thanksgiving is defined as the act of giving thanks. Okay, so what is thanks?
