

And Thank You to the Imperial Officers in attendance over the






MESSAGE FROM OUR RECORDER

We're excited to announce the new digital membership card. Effective August 2022, Nobles who pay their 2023 dues will have immediate access to their newly designed digital Membership card.

Nobles can access and present their digital membership card, which features the status of their dues two ways:

My FezCard Viewer available for download on Apple App Store or Google Play App Store.

Member Center Locate on the new SI.org Website.

For 2023, the two primary methods to determine if a member is current in their dues will include asking the Noble to present their new digital membership card on a mobile device or for the temple, club, or unit to scan the QR code on the Nobles existing hard card.

Scanning the QR code on the membership card, either the existing hard card or the new digital card, provides several benefits to the temple including in the area of operations and as a member engagement tool:

Decreases temple expenses by not having to pay for stickers and buck slip insert

Simplifies operation, no need to replace stickers on an annual basis

Digital card/scanning QR quickly determines the status of dues payment

Member Engagement:

Awarding credit for attendance at events and activities, which is especially handy for temples that award points and prizes for participation

Participating in contests and giveaways

Expressing an interest in joining a club or unit

Registering for an event or volunteer opportunities

As a result, Shriners International has discontinued the distribution of dues stickers in individual Nobles. While the focus remains on scanning the QR code or presenting the digital card to determine the status of dues, to assist in the transition, a limited number of 2023 sticker sheets will be sent to each temple so they can provide a dues sticker to Nobles on a case-by-case or as-requested basis.

When Nobles pay their 2023 membership dues, they will receive a 5x8 acknowledgement postcard that will announce the new process along with instructions on how to obtain their new digital membership card.

To address three commonly asked questions:

1. How can a Noble access their digital card if we don't have internet access? If internet connectivity is a concern, once the Noble accesses their card via one of the two options above, they can take a screenshot of the digital card, which automatically saves to their photo gallery. Thereafter, they can present the card as needed without needing an internet connection.
2. How can a temple, club, or unit scan a QR code? From an operational standpoint, the barrier to entry to utilize the QR technology is extremely low and simple to use. For the last three years, several Temples have been Scanning the QR code on the existing membership card to determine dues by purchasing a handheld scanner, or a mobile device, like a phone or tablet. Both options connect and communicate with WebFez.
3. Will the digital card display associate temples? Currently only the Noble's home temple will display on the My FezCard Viewer, however, we expect to add a display featuring associate temples by late summer/early fall.

The result of this effort is designed to directly reduce temple expenses, simplify operations, and increase member engagement.







DETROIT MASONIC TEMPLE

100th ANNIVERSARY

The Detroit Masonic Temple was designed by famed architect George Mason, who also designed the Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island with his partner Zachariah Rice. Over 20,000 Masons were present when the cornerstone of the temple was placed on September 18, 1922, using the same trowel that George Washington had used to set the cornerstone of the U. S. Capitol building in Washington D.C. in 1793. The building was dedicated on Thanksgiving Day 1926. The building has over 1,000 rooms, and several secret staircases, concealed passages, and hidden compartments in the floors. The Detroit Masonic Temple has been the largest Masonic Temple in the world since 1939, when the Chicago Masonic Temple was demolished. The stage of the auditorium is the second largest in the United States.

Shriners Legacy Program Connects Family Members

Are you a Shrine Legacy? The Legacy Program celebrates our fraternal bonds with those closest to us. Shriners International invites nobles to be part of the Legacy Program and to encourage family members to participate. Honor your family and yourself by sharing your legacy. The Shriners Legacy Program is open to any male family member such as Grandfathers, Fathers, Brothers, Sons, Grandsons, Uncles, Nephews, and In-laws.

PASS ALONG THE SHRINERS LEGACY



All family members who are Shriners are eligible to become part of the Legacy Program. To make the registration process easy, only one member of the family's legacy needs to register on Shriners Village. When logging in to your account on shrinersvillage.com, click on the "Membership" tab on the top of the web page. From this page, select "Legacy Program" on the left-hand side of the screen.

Each Legacy can download a certificate signed by the Imperial Potentate and Imperial Recorder. Shriners and their registered relatives can also order a special gold Legacy pin. Any new Shriners Legacy is eligible to receive a free pin for himself and up to two of his Shrine legacies. Nobles who became Shriners legacies prior to Jan. 1, 2012, are encouraged to become part of Shriners Legacy Program; these nobles may order a Legacy pin and certificate for themselves and their legacies for a contribution of \$5 or more per pin.
