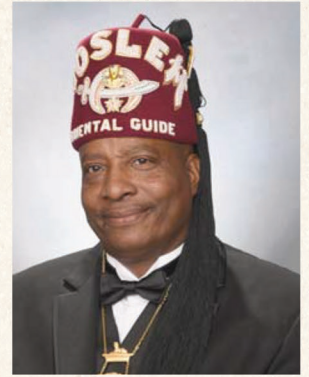
Changes for the 2026 Dues Year

Rolling out the newly designed membership cards and distribution will start late August 2025, (looks like the digital membership card). Plastic gold card will now be a plastic black card.

- A. The dues year will not be displayed on the card; the temple will have to scan a Noble membership card to validate he is in good standing. The dues year will appear on the digital dues card.
- B. Member number will not be displayed on the card, **only the Shrine ID#.**
- C. Cards will automatically be distributed upon remittance of a Noble's payment, and it's been posted/applied in WebFez towards 2026 dues year.
- D. Cards will automatically be processed every two (2) weeks starting in late August through December 2025.
- E. Associates will no longer receive a separate membership card, as their account is linked to their home temple and the temple can validate a member in good standing by scanning their card.
- F. All Total Life Members will automatically receive a new card in August 2025.
- G. All prepaid dues for 2026, those Nobles will automatically receive a new card in August 2025.
- H. Shriners International will not be distributing an acknowledgement postcard in 2026, this service will stop on 7/7/2025.
- I. **Shriners International will no longer be processing gold membership cards as of 7/7/2025.**
- J. **The temples will no longer be able to request a replacement membership card come 7/7/2025.**
- K. The temple can issue a paper temporary membership card for any new, restored, and affiliated members starting 7/7/2025 until 8/15/2025 while Shriners International is processing new membership cards in late August 2025, or directing the Noble to the digital Fez Card app.
- L. No more renewal stickers as of 1/1/2025.
- M. A letter will accompany the membership card to every Noble.

Seeing the Bigger Picture: An Oriental Guide's Reflection on the 2025 Shriners International Grand Session

Attending the 2025 Shriners International Grand Session in Atlanta was one of the most powerful experiences I've had so far in my journey as a Shriner. As an Oriental Guide, I know my job is to learn, observe, and prepare myself to one day lead my temple. This event gave me the perfect chance to do just that.

Held at the Hyatt Regency in the heart of downtown Atlanta, the Grand Session brought together thousands of Nobles from across the world. From the moment I arrived, I could feel the energy, the tradition, and the deep sense of brotherhood all around me. Everyone wore their red fezzes with pride, and conversations flowed in every corner of the hotel—from serious temple business to laughter between old friends.

As an Oriental Guide, I came with the mindset of a student—watching closely how other leaders carried themselves, how decisions were made, and how the spirit of the Shrine stayed strong even in such a large setting. It wasn't just about the ceremonies or the events. It was about understanding what keeps this brotherhood alive and growing. I watched Potentates speak with strength and kindness, and I saw how teamwork really made everything possible.

The Imperial Parade was a highlight I'll never forget. Watching temples from around the world march together in full regalia made me proud—not just to be a Shriner, but to be on the path toward greater leadership. Something else that meant a lot to me was the spiritual connection I felt. I met Shriners from other temples. We prayed together, talked about our journeys, and supported one another. It was inspiring to see how our values—like charity, brotherhood, and service—aligned so well with everything the Shrine stands for. I didn't have to choose between my faith and my fraternal life. The two walked hand in hand.

As the session came to a close, I took a quiet moment to reflect. Looking out at the sea of fezzes and banners, I thought about what it means to be a leader in training. It's not about titles or positions. It's about showing up, learning everything you can, and always thinking about how you can help your temple, your Nobles, and your community.

The 2025 Grand Session gave me more than a great experience—it gave me vision. I left Atlanta with a notebook full of ideas, a heart full of gratitude, and a clearer picture of what kind of leader I want to become.

If you've never been to an Imperial Session, I encourage you to go. And if you're an Oriental Guide like me, I challenge you to see it not just as a celebration, but as a classroom. Everything you need to grow into your role is there—you just have to be willing to pay attention.

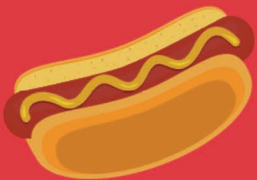
